College of Arts and Sciences

Honors Lists

Dean's List

The Dean's List is announced after each fall, winter, and spring term. To qualify, a student must be an admitted undergraduate, complete at least 12 credits taken for a letter grade during the term, and have a term GPA of 3.75 or better. Credits deducted do not count toward the minimum number of credits. Grade changes recorded through the second week of the subsequent term resulting in a change to the term GPA may affect the Dean's List notation (removal or addition).

Latin Honors

Latin honors are based on cumulative GPA, require graduating students to have completed all degree requirements, and have earned at least ninety credits in residence at the University of Oregon. Post-baccalaureate students are not eligible for Latin honors. The Office of the Registrar computes Latin honors during degree conferral.

The GPAs for each level of honors are as follows:

- **Summa:** must be 3.95 or higher
- **Magna:** must be between 3.85 and 3.94
- **Cum:** must be between 3.75 and 3.84
