ITAL 101. Beginning Italian I. 4 Credits.

Introduction to the language, cultural practices, and perspectives of Italian-speaking communities in Italy and elsewhere. Cultivates listening, speaking, reading, writing, and intercultural competence through conversation, cultural exploration, and other activities. Designed for beginners as the first of three in the sequence of Beginning Italian courses (ITAL101, 102, and 103).

Equivalent to: ITAL 104, ITAL 121

ITAL 102. Beginning Italian II. 4 Credits.

Introduction to the language, cultural practices, and perspectives of Italian-speaking communities in Italy and elsewhere. Cultivates listening, speaking, reading, writing, and intercultural competence through conversation, cultural exploration, and other activities. Designed for beginners as the second of three in the sequence of Beginning Italian courses (ITAL 101, 102, and 103). Sequence with ITAL 101, ITAL 103.

Requisites: Prereq: One from ITAL 101, ITAL 104, ITAL 121.

ITAL 103. Beginning Italian III. 4 Credits.

Introduction to the language, cultural practices, and perspectives of Italian-speaking communities in Italy and elsewhere. Cultivates listening, speaking, reading, writing, and intercultural competence through conversation, cultural exploration, and other activities. Designed for beginners as the third of three in the sequence of Beginning Italian courses (ITAL 101, 102, and 103). Students cannot receive credit for more than one of ITAL 103, ITAL 105, ITAL 122. Sequence with ITAL 101, ITAL 102.

Requisites: Prereq: ITAL 102.

Equivalent to: ITAL 105, ITAL 122

ITAL 104. Intensive First-Year Italian. 5 Credits.

Covers in two terms the work of ITAL 101, ITAL 102, ITAL 103. Students cannot receive credit for more than one of ITAL 101, ITAL 104, ITAL 121. Sequence.

Equivalent to: ITAL 101, ITAL 121

ITAL 105. Intensive First-Year Italian. 5 Credits.

Covers in two terms the work of ITAL 101, ITAL 102, ITAL 103. Students cannot receive credit for more than one of ITAL 103, ITAL 105, ITAL 122. Sequence.

Requisites: Prereq: ITAL 104.

Equivalent to: ITAL 103, ITAL 122

ITAL 121. Italian for Careers I. 4 Credits.

Introduction to Italian language and culture to start building meaningful relationships and personal connections with peers and potential business partners on different career paths. Coursework includes interpreting authentic Italian language sources (reading/listening/viewing) and producing language in presentational and interpersonal modes of communication (oral and written discussions, presentations) in familiar, everyday contexts. Students cannot receive credit for more than one of ITAL 101, ITAL 104, ITAL 121. Sequence with ITAL 122.

Equivalent to: ITAL 101, ITAL 104

ITAL 122. Italian for Careers II. 4 Credits.

Introduction to Italian language and culture to start building meaningful relationships and personal connections with peers and potential business partners on different career paths. Coursework includes interpreting authentic Italian language sources (reading/listening/viewing) and producing language in presentational and interpersonal modes of communication (oral and written discussions, presentations) in familiar, everyday contexts. Students cannot receive credit for more than one of ITAL 103, ITAL 105, ITAL 122. Sequence with ITAL 121.

Requisites: Prereq: One from ITAL 121, ITAL 102, ITAL 104.

Equivalent to: ITAL 103, ITAL 105

ITAL 150. Cultural Legacies of Italy. 4 Credits.

Italy's contributions to world cultures includes topics such as Italians in America, Italian cinema and its influence, the Italian Renaissance, Ancient Roman art, and Italy and migration today. Conducted in English.

A particular selection of material read by a student and discussed in conference with a faculty member.

ITAL 606. Practicum: [Topic]. 1-4 Credits.

A series of clinical experiences under academic supervision designed to integrate theory and principles with practice.
