MENA 404. Internship: [Topic]. 1-12 Credits.

Professional practice in an organization that integrates concepts studied at the university with career-related work experience.

MENA 405. Reading and Conference: [Topic]. 1-5 Credits.

A particular selection of material read by a student and discussed in conference with a faculty member.

MENA 407. Seminar: [Topic]. 1-5 Credits.

A small group of students studying a subject with a faculty member.

Although practices vary, students may do original research and exchange results through informal lectures, reports, and discussions.
