Dear President Scholz:

We are writing to inform you of forthcoming changes to the Peer Evaluation Visit and Reporting calendar that will impact University of Oregon.

During its July 2026 Commission Meeting, the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) established a new 8-year accreditation cycle to replace the current 7-year cycle. As part of this change, NWCCU staff created a balanced review cycle that included an assessment of the readiness of institutions to undergo their Mid-Cycle or Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness (EIE) evaluation visit later than planned in their current review cycle. As part of that assessment, University of Oregon was identified as an institution that could have an adjusted visit schedule. Accordingly, we have made that change in the revised evaluation schedule below.

To prepare for these visits, please note that institutions with a scheduled report or visit in 2027 have a choice to respond to the 2020 NWCCU Standards or the newly adopted Standards. Institutions with reports and visits in 2028 or later will be required to respond to the new Standards.

The dates in this letter for your visit cycle supersede any previously communicated dates.

The dates of the revised evaluation schedule for University of Oregon will be as follows:

- Ad Hoc Report Fall 2026
 - Recommendation 3: Fall 2024 Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness
- Mid-Cycle Review Fall 2028
 - Recommendation 1: Fall 2024 Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness
 - Recommendation 2: Fall 2024 Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness
- Year 6 - Standard 2 - Policies, Regulations, and Financial Review Fall 2030
- Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness Fall 2032
